What Our Students are Learning:

From STEM Specialist, Mrs. Samec:

- Kindergarten: Shapes! Students have been creating and identifying patterns, combining plane shapes, and will begin to recognize shapes in our environment.
- First Grade: What helps make a structure strong and stable? Students will be investigating strategies to apply in a structure design challenge.
- Second Grade: What happens when a part of the pollination system is missing? Students will be designing a hand pollinator to solve the problem! This week, they will investigate different materials and their properties to use in their design.
- Third Grade: How does light interact with different materials? Students begin investigations to understand how light travels and interacts. They will use their findings to design a lighting system.
- Fourth Grade: What can we learn about matter by identifying its properties? Students continue to investigate the "stuff" inside matter through direct and indirect observation.
- Fifth Grade: What forces affect a marble in motion? Students continue to investigate the forces affect a marble as it travels along a table, through the air, and on the floor.

From Music Specialist, Mrs. Smyth:

- First graders are listening to melodies that move upward and downward using scarves.
- Second grade students bounced balls with the beat of "You've Got A Friend like Me".
- The third graders are learning to read the names of the lines and spaces. They are singing songs from Russia, Italy and Poland.
- Fourth graders are singing songs from the 1950's: We Go Together, At The Hop and Twist and Shout.
- The fifth graders are completing their Lightshows created for songs from movies.

From ACHIEVE Specialist and Destination ImagiNation Coordinator, Mrs. Boatman:

Destination ImagiNation teams meet weekly from November to March. Challenges encourage children to construct equipment, design solar prototypes, present a movie trailer, improv news stories, design delivery devices, and carry out service-learning. Each team will choose a main challenge and work on instant challenges for the months of November and December. Good luck to the six Wilshire Park teams. Thank you to the managers: Dave Johnson, Alissa Brink, Joel Marquette, Krista Rosemeyer, Tiff Severson, Neil Carlson, and Barb Mathieu.

From Band Director, Mr. Ravndal:

- Congratulations to our 85 5th grade students who've started learning Band instruments this fall. What a fantastic turnout!
- We're now getting to the point of hitting notes consistently and kids are starting to pass pages on a weekly basis, which is our goal. Kids can always add more songs & pages to their assignment if they're mastering things quickly.
- Mark your calendars: Our first concert (yes, really!) is Monday, Nov. 28th, the first day back after Thanksgiving. We share the 7 p.m. concert with the Concert Band from the high school.
- The greatest key for success in Band is the daily at-home practice. Unfortunately, there are no short cuts! The goal is always 150 minutes per week (180 is the ideal). That kind of sustained work over time results in the greatest progress as well as the better student

commitment levels. Life tends to be busy if not hectic these days, but even if your student can't get in a full half-hour on a certain day, getting in some time -- even if it's only 10-15 minutes -- is far, far better than none.

Kindergarten Registration & Open Enrollment for 2012-13 School Year

Do you have a child who will be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2012 and live in the St. Anthony-New Brighton School District? Please e-mail cridge@stanthony.k12.mn.us or call the school office at 612.706.1200 to be added to our kindergarten mailing list for the 2012-13 school year. Please contact us even if you think we already know about your child!

If you or someone you know is considering open enrollment for the 2012-13 school year, please go to the district website for information and to apply online: www.stanthony.k12.mn.us and click on "Open Enrollment". To be considered for the first round of openings, you must apply for open enrollment by Sunday, January 15, 2012. Any new student wishing to enroll through open enrollment (even those with siblings attending Wilshire Park) must have completed the online open enrollment form. Each child within the family must have their own open enrollment form on file. (If you currently have a child attending Wilshire Park, you do not need to re-register that child for open enrollment). We are anticipating a limited number of openings for next year.

Art Adventures Volunteers Needed for Grades K-4

The Art Adventures Program is a picture presentation program sponsored by the Minneapolis Institute of Art (MIA). This year's theme will be "Let's Celebrate Life!" No art experience is needed to be a volunteer, and training will be provided.

Volunteers will attend one training session at the MIA in January. The training session includes a presentation by an Art Institute docent who will describe a series of eight works throughout the MIA. Each volunteer receives a thorough packet of information that summarizes what has been learned in the training session, as well as sample discussion questions aimed for your child's

grade level. The dates for the training sessions are Thursday, January 5th from 5:30-8:00 p.m. and Tuesday, January 31st from 10:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

Once trained, volunteers will lead one to four 15-30 minute discussions about the selected works of art. You will be provided with reproductions to carry to the classroom, as well as hands-on props that may help explain the art. Volunteers will work with the teacher to determine the time and date of class meetings in the months of February and March. This will be followed by a field trip to the museum in Late March or Early April.

Screening Updates and Reminder to Dress for the Weather

- Vision screening took place on November 1st, 8th, and 9th at Wilshire Park. We will rescreen those who were absent or did not pass on December 2nd. If your child does not pass the rescreening, you will be sent a referral letter.
- Hearing screening was completed in October for most students. You will receive a referral letter if your child does not pass. I appreciate those who have already returned their hearing referrals.
- The weather is getting colder and snow will soon be upon us! Please dress your child for the weather daily. They will go outside unless the air temperature/wind chill is less than minus 10 degrees. Hats, mittens/gloves and winter coats are a must and snow pants and boots as soon as the snow flies. We have a limited supply in the nurse's office for students who forget them. I will accept donations for boots, snow pants, jackets, scarves, hats and mittens/gloves if you are interested in donating.

There is still time to get your child vaccinated against the flu. The supply for influenza vaccine is not a problem this year, so please consider getting your child vaccinated now. The shot this year contains both the H1N1 and seasonal influenza strains.

Question of the Week:

Question: How cold must it be before students stay inside for recess?

Answer: Most days children will play outside during lunch recess. Students should dress properly for the day's weather. In cold weather, gloves, boots, hats, and snowpants are essential. If the weather conditions are questionable, we will check with the local weather station at about 11:00 a.m. In general, if it is raining, or the temperature is colder than ten degrees below zero, we stay inside. However, if the sun is warm with no wind, we may go outside. When the windchill is colder than ten degrees below zero, recess is usually indoors. Whether or not to have indoor recess is also dependent on the age of the students. If possible, fourth and fifth graders will go outside at lunch recess during inclement weather because this is their only opportunity to be outdoors.
